



THEATRE AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

DID YOU KNOW THAT PARTICIPATING IN PERFORMING ARTS CAN HELP YOUR CHILD LEARN A NEW LANGUAGE?

A lot has been written about the benefits of performing arts for children's learning. Performing arts lets your child have fun while learning moral values, improving communication and social skills, and expanding their general knowledge. You may ask, however, what is the role that performing arts play in learning languages? Below are some reasons you should use theater for your child's second (or third) language acquisition:

Children need extra motivation to learn languages. A magic show, theater, or any other type of gestural activity provides participation, excitement, and surprises.

These fun and relaxed environments are ideal for children to absorb and learn a new language. It allows them to internalize phrases and vocabulary without even realizing it!

Theater helps children learn not only the most "formal" parts of the language, but also idioms, vocabulary, intonation, and structures that don't always appear in books. The language is typically used in a conversational manner.

When the actors are native speakers, children hear different types of accents and lesserknown expressions. The native speakers bring their own flair to the table and introduce listeners to different linguistic stylings.

Although actors are at the center of the performance, often children have the opportunity to perform in or engage in other ways with the production. Whether at a theater, at home, or in a classroom, playing, improvising, and role-playing are the most effective ways of acquiring a language, as they improve children's communication skills.

In fact, role-play in particular is one of the most widely used techniques in classrooms to teach and learn languages. This activity allows children to become anyone for a short period of time and express themselves in a more forthright way.

The good thing about watching performing arts in other languages is that we can choose the theme. If it's a theme that children enjoy, they'll be more willing to listen and learn.

The fact that the plays and performances usually represent everyday situations allows children to learn vocabulary and expressions that are used in everyday life. It'll definitely have a lot of practical use if you're raising bilingual kids.

The ultimate goal is making the language heard as something normal. The learning should be concealed within fun and entertainment so that children have the opportunity to learn in a dynamic and interactive environment.

I bambini e i ragazzi hanno bisogno di molta motivazione per imparare una lingua straniera. Uno show di magia, teatro, o

qualsiasi altro tipo di attività artistica richiede partecipazione, frenesia e sorpresa. Questi ambienti divertenti e rilassanti sono ideali per bambini e ragazzi per assorbire e acquisire una nuova lingua. Inoltre permette loro di immagazzinare frasi e lessico senza nemmeno rendersene conto!

Il teatro aiuta anche a non imparare solo le parole 'formali' della lingua ma anche idiomi, lessico, intonazione e strutture della frase che non appaiono nei libri. La lingua viene usata in forma di dialogo.

Quando gli attori sono madrelingua, i bambini e i ragazzi sentono diversi tipi di accenti e espressioni che non conoscono. Grazie alla genuinità dei madrelingua, i partecipanti hanno l'opportunità di ascoltare ed imparare diversi stili linguistici.

Anche se si è soliti pensare che solo il protagonista è al centro dell'attenzione, tutti i partecipanti contribuiscono alla buona riuscita di uno spettacolo. I modi più efficaci per acquisire una lingua e per migliorare lo speaking dei ragazzi è proprio la recitazione, l'improvvisazione e i giochi di ruolo, che siano a teatro, in classe o a casa.

In particolare, il gioco di ruolo è tra le tecniche più usate a scuola per insegnare ed imparare una lingua. Questa attività permette a bambini e ragazzi di immedesimarsi nei panni di qualcun altro per un breve periodo di tempo ed esprimersi come loro.

Inoltre, la cosa migliore del teatro in una lingua straniera è che si sceglie un tema. Se il tema piace ai bambini o ai ragazzi, saranno maggiormente disposti ad ascoltare ed apprendere la lingua.

Oggigiorno gli spettacoli teatrali rappresentano situazioni della vita quotidiana e questo porta i ragazzi ad acquisire lessico ed espressioni della vita di tutti i giorni. Mettere in pratica ciò che si ha imparato a teatro, sarà poi sempre più facile

Ed infine, con il teatro si vuole trasformare l'ascolto della lingua straniera, in qualcosa di normale. L'apprendimento si fonde con divertimento ed intrattenimento in modo che i ragazzi imparano la lingua in un ambiente dinamico e stimolante.
